Live Well, Link Well is a free, confidential service offering practical or emotional support of a non-medical kind.

We've recently begun working with a Live Well Link Worker named Penny. She and other Link Workers build relationships with residents and families in need of social care and wellbeing support.



These services can range from help with managing carer services through exercise and weight management classes to befriending services for vulnerable and lonely people.



Latest news

Name of the new medical centre and opening date

Thank you to everyone who shared their suggestions for the name of the new medical centre. All the ideas we received were considered and shortlisted.

The GPs from Brickfields Surgery, Greenwood Surgery and Kingsway Surgery then voted on their favourite from your suggestions and we are delighted to announce that our new premises will be called:

We have also been informed that all the building works on the new medical centre should be finished by the end of August so we are currently working towards a possible moving date in September. We will keep you updated in future newsletters of the opening date.

Primary Care Networks

In other news, a new national NHS plan gives all GP practices the chance to work in partnership through "Primary Care Networks" (PCNs). These PCNs should allow local GP practices to work more closely with each other, with community NHS staff and other health and care organisations to offer residents better, more joined-up care. All mid Essex practices are currently aligning themselves into PCNs.

PCNs will start from the 1 July. You may not notice a difference straight away but over time there will be more integrated working across local health and care and with district councils. The South Woodham Ferrers PCN will allow your GPs to be at the forefront of decision-making about local health and care.

There will also be additional staff in practices over the next three years, including more Live Well Link Workers, clinical pharmacists, physiotherapists and paramedics, to free up GP time so they can prioritise seeing patients who need their expertise and support.

Other services moving to the medical centre

Provide, a not-for-profit community interest company will deliver a number of NHS services at the South Woodham Ferrers Clinic (opposite ASDA). These include Essex Sexual Health Service, outpatients physiotherapy, children's speech and language therapy, ENT (ear, nose and throat), audiology services and assessments for autism.

The South Woodham Ferrers clinic is owned by NHS Property Services, a national body separate from local NHS organisations including NHS Mid Essex Clinical Commissioning Group. How the clinic premises will be used in future is still under discussion and there is not yet a final decision.
